### SUMMARY:

Provide students with appropriate learning activities and experiences designed to help them fulfill their potential for intellectual, emotional, physical, and social growth. Enable students to develop competencies and skills to function successfully in society.

### QUALIFICATIONS:

- (2) Valid Florida Designated Subject vocational Education or Career Technical Education credential in the field of study
- (3) Valid Welding Certifications
- (4) Highly qualified as per NCLB guidelines
- (5) Five (5) years' experience in the field of Welding
- (6) Satisfactory criminal background check
- (7) ESOL Endorsement/Certification preferred

**KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, COMPETENCIES AND ABILITIES:** To perform the job successfully, an individual should demonstrate the competencies:

### PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- (1) Serve as a role model for students, dressing and grooming professionally, demonstrating the importance and relevance of learning, accepting responsibility, and demonstrating pride in the honorable profession of teaching.
- (2) Instruct students in subject areas, i.e., use, maintenance, and the safe operation of tools and equipment, codes or regulations related to the welding program
- (3) Instruct students in the importance of accuracy, neatness, efficiency, resourcefulness and good work habits in obtaining employment in industries that depend on welding to build their products
- (4) Maintain a clean and orderly classroom and lab area; ensuring waste and byproducts are disposed according to Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) standards and procedures
- (5) Assists in the placement of students in internships or cooperative work experience

- (6) Create a classroom environment that is conducive to learning and appropriate to the maturity, interest, and abilities of students
- (7) Establish high standards and expectations for all students to accept responsibility for behavior.
- (8) Supervise students and consistently administer rules regarding student behavior.
- (9) Assist students in learning to accept responsibility, demonstrate respect for people and property, and demonstrate self-discipline.
- (10) Develop, maintain, and implement lesson plans
- (11) Keep accurate records of student attendance and behavior, including any tardiness, and submit to the administration in a timely fashion.
- (12) Monitor the pacing of instruction and budget class time efficiently by providing clear directions, outlining expectations, and effectively bringing to closure instructional experiences.
- (13) Use effective presentation skills when employing direct instruction, including appropriate vocabulary and examples, clear and legible visuals, and articulate and audible speech.
- (14) Establish a professional rapport with students that earns their respect.
- (15) Provide individual and small-group instruction to adapt the curriculum to the needs of students with varying intellectual and artistic abilities, and to accommodate a variety of instructional activities
- (16) Evaluate each student's performance and growth in knowledge and aesthetic understandings, and prepare progress reports
- (17) Create a stimulating, attractive, organized, functional, healthy, and safe classroom, with proper attention to the visual, acoustic, and thermal environments.
- (18) Complete in a timely fashion all records and reports as required by law and regulation or requested by the administration. Maintain accurate attendance records.
- (19) Work cooperatively with adults assigned to the classroom (e.g., paraprofessionals, student teachers, parents, and volunteers), establishing clear expectations for roles and responsibilities.
- (20) Maintain positive, cooperative, and mutually supportive relationships with the administration, instructional staff, students, parents, and representatives of resource agencies within the community.
- (21) Attend required staff meetings and serve, as appropriate, on staff committees.
- (22) Continue to grow professionally through collaboration with colleagues and professional growth experiences.
- (23) Maintain in safe working condition and safely operate electronic and other equipment needed to carry out job functions and responsibilities.
- (24) Protect confidentiality of records and information gained as part of exercising professional duties and use discretion in sharing such information within legal confines.
- (25) Attends IEP, Section 504, or other related meetings necessary for student assessment and/or compliance with federal and/or state law
- (26) Maintain professional competence through in-service education activities provided by the school and/or in self-selected professional growth activities

**PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:**

Medium Work: Exerting up to 50 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 20 pounds of force as frequently as needed to move objects

Welder's perform physically demanding work including lifting and carrying heavy objects, stooping, kneeling, crouching or crawling in awkward positions. Exposure to harmful fumes, odors, loud noise, or dangerous machinery. Use of safety garments such as gloves, hardhats, protective chemical suits, and devices to protect eyes, respiratory system and/or hearing is required.
