

CHAPTER 4.00 - CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

CURRICULUM COUNCIL

4.19

1. A district-wide curriculum council shall be organized at the beginning of each school year at the direction of the Division of Curriculum and Instruction.
- II. Membership shall include one (1) teacher representative from each school, one (1) elementary principal or assistant, one (1) middle school principal or assistant, and one (1) high school principal or assistant. The Elementary Director shall be an advisory member and the Executive Director for Curriculum and Instruction shall coordinate the efforts of the council.
- III. The curriculum council shall have five (5) meetings per year.
- IV. The basic purposes of the curriculum council shall be to:
 - A. provide for effective articulation among the various levels of education.
 - B. provide for the vertical and horizontal development of the instructional programs in the schools; that is to develop a logical sequence of experiences from kindergarten through the twelfth grade within the various subject matter areas.
 - C. evaluate the program continuously and make the necessary recommendations for curriculum improvement.
 - D. encourage experimentation on a sound basis through proven research.
 - E. serve as a medium for the exchange of ideas, teaching techniques and materials.
 - F. serve as a clearinghouse for problems and make plans for the solution of these problems.
 - G. make recommendations for in-service programs.
 - H. stimulate curriculum development in the individual schools.
